DISCIPLINE POLICY

By State Law, corporal punishment (violent physical actions) is not allowed. Even if this law did not exist, violence of any kind is not allowed either between caregiver and the children or between children.

Conflicts between children are a natural part of finding one's place in the world. With boundaries clear, children learn problem solving skills, and the confidence to resolve their conflicts. Our job as care givers, is to encourage children in resolving conflicts. When intervention is necessary, discussion, choices, and time-outs are all viable options. Positive reinforcement is a major factor in keeping conflicts to a minimum. For more information, please read Positive Discipline by Jane Nelson.
